February 24

February 25

Tuesday 12 to 5 PM rehearsal session The rehearsal section is for everyone. The first session will be of individual sectionals samba Tamborim section, a Samba percussion section Plattinella, Reco-reco, Cuica, and Agogo (*Agogo quartro boca welcome*) Repequie and Caixa section, and Repequie de More, and a Surdo section. Dancers will be divided into three groups Samba Dancer sections A, B, and C. Section A will represent the professional Samba dancers. Section B will be the non-professional Samba dancers. Section C will represent the animal section which will be divided into six groups according to the name of the animal costume they have. In the second half of rehearsal, everyone will rehearse as a group.

February 26 *Mandatory* rehearsal
